Putting God In A Box- A series on how we limit God's work in our lives

Appearance: Fighting Against The Things We See: Part 2 By: Patrick Bucksot

Last month, I wrote about how we struggle with judging things by how they appear. This struggle usually happens through our sight and our hearing. However, the other senses of smell, taste and touch may also cause us to incorrectly judge an appearance. What our five senses judge can cause us to question whether things are real or imagined. Our faith can be placed on the yo-yo of fear and doubt if we allow the senses to control how we react to things.

I am not saying that we should ignore what our senses are telling us. God has given us a tremendous system with which we can see, feel, taste, hear and smell. They each provide compelling information to react to dangers or even good situations. My point is this; there are times that our senses can deceive us into believing the opposite of what is happening. In those times, we must allow our faith to ignite our spirit man to believe what God said, and overcome what our senses are telling us.

This month, I want to explore how we judge the appearance of a matter from a couple of other vantage points.

One area where we struggle with the appearance of a matter is what we think see God doing or not doing. Pastor Ron has taught us that we have great favor with God. We can read numerous examples in His Word about the favor He placed on someone. A few examples are: Moses, Joseph, Esther, Daniel, King

David, Mary, Elizabeth, Peter, James and John. Every one of these people had favor with God and yet, every one of these people had times in their lives when they could not see the hand of God over them.

Let me give you an example. Joseph had several dreams from the Lord that his family would bow down to him. Shortly after the dreams, his brothers sold him into slavery, and then was jailed after being falsely accused. How could a man with that much favor go through such terrible trials? (1 Pet. 1:7) God's favor was putting him into position to save a nation. God's favor never ceased with Joseph but it had to allow certain things to happen so Joseph could be in the right place to save his family and his nation. As you can see, God's favor wasn't just with Joseph; it was with the entire nation.

When he began to have the dreams, he could see the favor of God. And, growing up, he was the favorite son of Jacob. After being sold into slavery though, Joseph probably struggled with his purpose. In his dreams, he could see greatness, but reality was showing him hardship.

After years of separation from his family, God finally revealed his ultimate plan to Joseph. Joseph could see that his dreams had a greater purpose.

Pastors Corner- A word from Pastor Ron – “2011 – The Year of His Presence”

Isaiah 54:2-3

As we close 2010 and move into 2011 we open a new door that will be, what I believe, to be the most powerful year in history. There is a stirring within the global body of Christ. There is a refreshed thirst and hunger for the presence of God. Our focus within the global body of Christ has been so much on the things (gifts) of God, which has an importance, but we have misplaced the burning desire and hunger for His presence.

I am excited with what the Lord has been showing me that will come to pass in 2011. Let me take a moment and recap the last few months of Pastor Corner, at BOGIO the last 6 months of 2010 we have been walking through what the meaning of Apostolic Ministry involves and how we as a body fit into that ministry. We have come to understand that not all are called into the Apostolic Office (Apostle, Prophet, Pastor, Evangelist, or Teacher) but we all have an apostolic anointing. It has been an awesome and exciting time teaching and learning what the apostolic ministry has for this region and around the world.

I shared a few months ago about the vision I had of a supernatural tsunami that was coming with three wave swells, first swell was the restoration of apostolic prayer, the second wave swell of signs and miracles, and the third wave swell being the greatest harvest of souls ever. The tsunami starts with an earthquake off shore that causes the waves to swell and move at great speed. The Lord has been shaking the grounds in 2010 and the wave swells will come in 2011. So I pray you have waxed your surf boards and watch for the wave because it will come quickly.

2011 The Springboard into His arms Year

2011 will be the springboard that will launch you into operating in apostolic anointing. Talking to men and women in ministry around the world the same sense of stirring is being felt on a global level. The exciting thing is that 2011 has the potential to be one of the most powerful and exciting year's ever in ministry. I say "*Potential to be*" because you and I have a part in this global move of God. We can't sit at home or in a church and hope a move of God shows up somewhere. It is time to bring Isaiah 54:2-3 to come alive.

(2) "*Enlarge the places of your tent, and let them stretch out the curtains of your dwellings; Do not spare; Lengthen your cords, and strengthen your stakes. (3) For you shall expand to the right and the left, and your descendants will inherit the nations, and make the desolate cities inhabited.*"
Isaiah 54:2-3

As we walk into 2011 we are stepping into a time of saturation, a soaking in the presence of the Lord. The more we soak the more we are infused with the lingering fragrance of God. That fragrance is going to linger after you leave. In this soaking is where we come to a total surrender to His will and His desires. When Moses went up to mount Horeb (Exodus 3:1-5; 6: 1-8) he received the directions that would lead him to rescue a nation. He went to Mount Sinai and received word from the Lord on how to lead the children of Israel. When Moses came off Mount Sinai from a soaking encounter time with God his face and skin shone so brightly he had to cover himself. (Exodus 34:29-35) You see Moses would soak in the presence of the Lord and it changed the world!

When Jesus would go away and be with the Father He would soak in the presence of the Lord. Jesus took Peter, James and John with him high on a mountain and the presence of the Lord fell on the mountain in a cloud. Jesus was transfigured in the cloud of His presence and He became shining exceedingly like white like snow, such as no launderer on earth can whiten. Out of that soaking presence stepped Moses (first level of anointing) and Elijah (second level of anointing) then the voice of the Lord came saying, "This is My beloved Son. Hear Him!" (Mark 9:1-7)

When Jesus and the apostles finished feeding and teaching the 5,000 Jesus sent the apostles to cross the sea to the other side while He went to the mountain and spent time soaking with the Father. During that time a storm came and the disciples were afraid of dying. Jesus went from the soaking in the presence of the Lord to doing the impossible, "walking on the water!" (Matthew 14:22-33)

The disciples stepped into a room with 120 and soaked in the presence of the Lord they became in “One Accord” then the Fire that was promised fell and they were filled with the Holy Spirit. They stepped out of the soaking encounter of God and 3,000 were saved!

It does not surprise me but it excites me that there is a drawing of the Body of Christ to rediscover the hunger and thirst for the presence of God. When we come to the decision to spend soaking time with the Lord we will see the move of God in our lives and ministries. We must find our mountain (soaking place) and spend quality time with the Lord just soaking in His presence.

What soaking time is not! It is not a place of Intercessory (Intercessory is important) You can soak when in Intercessory prayer but it is not the soaking I am talking about. It is not a place to cry out 911 calls to God (Crying out to God is important). As a Matter of fact when you are soaking with the Lord you know that He already knows your needs. It is not a place where you are trying to receive anything except His heart’s desire for you. It is not a place to beg God.

What is this soaking time? It is a place where you and the Lord can get real and intimate with each other. In that place you get the distractions away and just spend time enjoying each other. In this place you are just seeking to bless the Lord. To hear what is on His heart. It is a place where the Lord shares His heart and His direction for you. It is a place where He increases His anointing. It is a place He infuses His lingering fragrance into you.

Why is this important? Because, if we look at the blueprints of God in His word we see where the infusion comes, it comes in the soaking time. This is a year where we can find that mountain and soak in His lingering presence both by ourselves and in a corporate setting. We will see the churches and services being changed into soaking churches and services. When this happens then when you walk beyond your mountain the lingering presence of God will be ushered ahead of you and will remain when you leave.

This is not a church thing. It is not a title thing; it is not a ministry thing. It is a Body of Christ thing. You are a vital part of what the Lord is going to do in 2011. You are a vital part of the outpouring of God in 2011. It is the deep desire of the Lord for you to spend quality soaking time with Him. In this soaking place you see the shadow heal (Acts 5:12-16). In this soaking place the lingering presence of God is infused from you to the very cloths and handkerchiefs from you and when carried to the sick they will be healed. (Acts 19:11-16) In this soaking place the ones that mistreat, hurt and try to kill your faith will be saved and the fallout of Glory will draw those around you to be drawn to the Lord. (Acts 16: 25-40)

How do I get to this soaking place? The first thing you do to get to this soaking place is make the decision to get alone with God. Before you get on the defense please hear this. I have learned that everyone no matter of how long they have had an active relationship with the Lord has to make the decision to get closer. Moses made the decision to meet God on the mountain. Jesus made the decision to leave everyone and meet the Father on the mountain. The disciples had to make the decision to go to the upper room and remain until the encounter with God. You have to make the decision to increase your relationship with the Lord. We all have to make a decision to soak and not petition God. Please don’t misunderstand me to intercede is important, to pray for others is important, to pray in times of need is important, but we can’t advance in the relationship or the kingdom without soaking time. The next thing you need to do is set the time aside for you and Him. But I am so busy! I have learned that if you line up what the Lord wants with your wants He makes it happen. So pray for the soaking time with Him. Now the key is not if you get the time but don’t fill that time with other things. Then get into a personal, unconditional, and repent of anything that may place a wall between you and Him. Then make the decision to soak and not to leave until He shows up. He will show up powerfully! Then listen, listen, listen and listen some more! It will intensify more and more as you spend the time with Him. The key that sets everything into motion is expectation!

This is going to be an extraordinary year of the tangible presence of the Lord. You have an awesome part in the plan of the Lord for 2011. My grandfather told me as I was growing up, “You can do whatever you desire and the only one stopping you is YOU!” How true.

Buckle up, place your tray in the upright position and prepare to takeoff to your destiny!

He could see that God had meant everything for good when others tried to bring him shame or harm. God's purpose was not to have Joseph's family bow down to him, but to have Joseph in a place where he could preserve a nation. It wasn't about lordship over his family but favor for them in the time of need. God had placed so much favor on Joseph, the Pharaoh of Egypt felt compelled to allow his family to dwell in the land of Goshen.

Joseph could not always see the hand of God, but we know that His hand was always present with Joseph. We must now believe that as a child of God, His favor for us is always working on our behalf. We have our ups and downs. We go through struggles and sometimes believe that God has forsaken us, but I must tell you this: Don't look at the appearance of your situation, but allow God to finish the work that He has begun in you. His desire for all of us is to be a greater reflection of His son. Sometimes we have to be refined like silver, which He never stops working to remove those things that don't reflect His character.

Another area where we struggle with appearance is how we look at others. We judge by the outward appearance of a man rather than their heart. The true heart of a man will be displayed by his deeds.

In Luke 10, we can see the true heart of three men in the story of the Good Samaritan. After the man from Jerusalem was robbed, left naked and wounded in the road, a priest and a Levite passed him by going to the other side of the road. This is very troubling because these two men, by their profession, should have offered help. If the man could see them coming, and if their clothing provided a clue about their title, he probably felt that they would help him. However, their appearance and title did not line up with what was in their hearts.

When the Samaritan approached the injured man he put everything aside to provide assistance. For the Samaritan to help a Jewish man was unheard of. The Jews and the Samaritans did not like each other at all. The

Samaritans were treated as outcasts by the Jews and they had no inheritance with the nation of Israel. However, the Samaritan put aside his own plans and the national division to help a stranger. He administered immediate aid and then transported him to a nearby inn so he could recover. He also prepaid the debt and offered to pay any other costs that might be incurred. You see, there are two sides to the appearance in this story. The man from Jerusalem would have to realize that not everyone from Samaria is a dog, and the Samaritan had to put aside the appearance of the division between two people groups. The Samaritan did not see a Jew, he saw an injured man. He placed the value of a soul over the value of a fight.

We have the same struggles at times. We wrestle with stereo types placed on people. I believe that every one of us struggles with stereo types. However, we need to take a serious look into our own lives to see what we wrestle with before we jump to conclusions about others. We need to allow God to place us into a position to pray for someone rather than letting the enemy make us think that we are in a position to make others our prey.

When Jesus arrived at the tombs, He did not see a man full of anger and hate, He saw a man that needed deliverance. When accusers brought the woman caught in adultery, Jesus looked into the self righteousness of the accusers and the woman whose soul was clothed in sin. He saw that both the accusers and the woman needed to be clothed in His righteousness. When Jesus saw the Samaritan woman, He did not see a woman with a sordid past, He saw a woman that needed to know that God loved her very much and wanted her to have His Spirit dwell within her.

We need to have the eyes of God when we look at others. If we can look at others with the eyes of the Lord, they can rise up to the expectations of God rather than be beat down by our selfish standards.

Appearance: Fighting Against The Things We See – Part 2 By: Patrick Bucksot

These two areas in which we struggle cause us to have vain imaginations. I like to call it 'Vain Imaginitis'. Our imaginations really get the best of us at times. When we look into a situation, our imaginations begin to work and try to analyze the information. When we do this we often say, "*From the outside looking in, I believe that this is...*" Unless directly involved, we are always on the outside looking in.

A simple 'perceived' word or deed can cause our imaginations to run wild. We believe that what we have heard or seen is 100% fact and run around spreading gossip. We fail to understand that we have only received part of the information and taken it out of context. This misinformation is a destroyer of families, relationships and reputations. This is also a problem with God's Word. Well meaning people take portions of God's Word and uses it outside of its intended context. This will also destroy families, relationships and reputations. God's Word can stand on its own merit. We do not have to make anything up or come up with exotic theories to bring people into the Kingdom.

I Thessalonians 5:22 say's – "*Abstain from all appearances of evil*". God wants us to be so pure before Him that we should not even give an opportunity for someone to think anything else of us but the fact that we are a child of God. Billy Graham was so adamant about abstaining from an appearance of evil that he would not go onto the same elevator if a woman was on there by herself. He did not want to give anyone room to believe that he was living anything less than the Gospel that he proclaimed. If the appearance of evil can cause one person to doubt your integrity, your work for God can be in jeopardy. It is harder to restore lost reputation than to sustain it. Sustaining it can be difficult, but if we follow God's Word, we put all of the pressure on Him. His word will not fail us, but

if we don't use it, it can't help us.

As hard as we try, we cannot hide inside our glass houses. Yes, there are things that we can hide from others, but we can't hide from God. His imaginations of us are not in vain. He looks at us with the tenderest love that is beyond the knowledge of men. We can't do enough to cause His love to fail. We do bring Him disappointment when we bring our own offering for sin, but, we can't pay our sin debt with a spotted lamb. Our sin debt can only be paid by the blood of Jesus. One genuine cry out for His mercy will wipe away all of our shame.

So too, we must have the same mercy on others when they cry out from their shame. We are made in the image of God. Within that image is a love that goes beyond the knowledge of men. Within that image lies a mercy that breaks the yoke of bondage. Within that image is a grace that offers up forgiveness that destroys hatred. The very image of God displayed through us is the same image that Jesus displayed when He walked on this earth 2000 years ago.

When we walk in the Spirit of God and display the fruit of the Spirit as written in Galatians chapter 5, others get to witness God walking in the flesh. No, we are not God incarnate, but we can display His character. When we desire of life of His character we bring Him the greatest honor that He is due.

Wrestling with appearances can be difficult battles. Submitting our imaginations (**2 Cor. 10:5, 6**) to the Word and will of God isn't always easy. Our display of His character is often mingled with our own character. We do not always bring honor to the King of Kings, but we cannot be dismayed by our failures. His love for us never fails. His favor will never end. When we struggle with failure we need to just repent and remember **Philippians 1:6** - *Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform [it] until the day of Jesus Christ.*
