**The Weapons of Our Warfare- A series on our spiritual weapons -**

**Humility** By: Patrick Bucksot

There is a scene played out that is very real in the lives of many people. Someone gets fixated on an individual because they see them from a glamorous view point and believe that the person is like that all of the time. They imagine what it would be like to live in their shoes or be in their circle of friends. They have dreams of meeting their fixation. If their dream does come true, it is usually met with great disappointment because their fixation is not what was imagined. Most come away feeling dejected because they were treated poorly and made to feel like they were not important and intruding in the space of the glamour. This happens at all levels of society when anyone is placed on a pedestal; they will eventually make a mistake in the eyes of the one who put them there and be unceremoniously removed.

Most of the disappointment starts with someone seeing your pride. Most of us can recognize the pride of another person but can't see our own pride. Pride is the complete opposite of humility. Pride is the source of all who fall from power. There have been many ministries consumed by pride. Pride is one thing that God detests.

I know that I am supposed to be writing about humility but pride is what rages against it so easily. Pride is what undermines the foundations of humility. I will have to say here that we should be very careful not to have our testimony steal any glory from God. God is jealous and will not share His glory with anyone. Be careful of those whose testimonies are proclamations of their good works for God. It is great to tell about ministry

opportunities that God has given us, but do not shine the light on yourselves. It is God who has called us and God who works in and through us. And to God goes all of the Glory, Honor and Praise. **Prov. 27:2** says – *“Let another man praise you, and not your own mouth; A stranger, and not your own lips.”* **James 4:6** and **1Peter 5:5** state – “God resists the proud and gives grace to the humble.”

There are many other scriptures that declare God's opinion of pride but I believe that you get the picture.

We could all make a more concerted effort at humility. Humility is very hard to walk in and very easy to lose. But as a weapon of warfare, it shatters every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God. When we have something that comes against us, how do we react? Do our feelings get hurt or do we pray for those who spitefully use us. When we think that we should get a promotion but some else gets it, do we get angry or congratulate the other person? When someone has become the star athlete, do we get jealous or do we work that much harder to improve our game? When someone gets the invitation to minister and you feel that God has given you a message to preach, do you refuse to support that individual or do you pray that God ignites a fire of anointing in them?

I could go on with many other examples, but I have already written many of my own weaknesses for you to read. I have suffered many bouts with pride, only to realize that God has always been with me.

When we walk in humility, we are refusing to give place to the enemy.

I am so excited that the India Ministry Team has returned with reports of powerful and awesome accomplishments on the mission trip. The report of many people coming to know the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior is incredible. The inspiration and encouragement of over 400 pastors is outstanding. The ministry of praying for many and seeing miracles in the lives of the ones they prayed for is awesome. The lifting up of a school, praying for the Minister of Education just to name a few of the many visible accomplishments; not to mention the many accomplishments and lives changed that they may never know about. I want to thank each and every one of you that supported the team and mission in your prayers and or finances.

You may think that they are called in a special way or that you have to go to another nation to operate in evangelism. That is not true. We are all called to share the love of Christ. One of the things in the training of the team, as they prepared to go to India, I stressed was that the Gospel of Jesus Christ can stand on its own. We do not have to invent a way to make the gospel powerful; it is designed to be powerful no matter what comes against it. I told them to share the love of God and that love will open the hearts.

In **Matthew 22:37-39** when Jesus was asked, “*What is the most important commandments of God?*” He answered in a unique and powerful way. “*You shall love your Lord God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength. This is the first and great Commandment. And the second is like it, you shall love your neighbor as yourself.*” This is very important in our walk with the Lord because it describes two of the most important things on the heart of the Father. We are unable to accomplish anything in ministry or our lives to its fullest without loving the Lord with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. When we grab a hold of the first commandment we overflow our love into the second commandment; to love our neighbor as our self. I feel the church as a whole (around the world) is trying to manifest a love for the neighbor from the love they have designed and are trying to reach people by obligation instead of passion. When we fall passionately in love with our Lord we see the cup overflowing into a new type of love for those around us. It is as if we are looking now through the eyes of the Father and through His heart. We reach others because our love is so hungry and so satisfied at the same time we want everyone around us to experience the rich love of the Father.

Patrick has mentioned, at his and Beth’s home group meeting, that we all are called to share the Love of the Father. We are all required to share a type of love that is not hypocritical or conditional. This type of love only comes when we are in passionate love with the

Father, with all our heart, soul, mind and strength.

God longs for us to share our love for Him to those around us. The enemy tries so hard to make the Body of Christ, embarrassed or afraid or even judgmental of those around us. When in the Kingdom mentality we see opportunity to advance the Kingdom. You have the opportunity to advance the Kingdom of God. That is exciting.

Sadly, in most cases, most of the Body of Christ will not ask one person to church in a lifetime. We are missing an opportunity to advance the Kingdom of God if we find excuses instead of people to share the Love of God with. Let’s break that curse on the church and start advancing the Kingdom of God!

As I was praying about the next few months the Lord placed on my heart for October to be the month of Evangelism! Lets pray, prepare, step out and start asking people to come to church. Let’s get involved this month in ways to reach the lost and hurting for Jesus Christ. Let’s use our work areas, school areas, shopping areas, recreation areas, and neighborhoods as a harvesting field for the Kingdom of God. Let’s come together and see how we can bring the power of the Love of the Father to those around us! We get excited with a football game, a Hockey game, soccer game, car races why not with the advancement of the kingdom by bringing people to church and the Kingdom of God!

The Breath of God Symbol is a picture of a Christian reaching a hand to a man needing Christ. Our motto is “*Connecting Locally, Reaching Globally*”. Together we can fill the Breath of God International Church to the point that we have to move all the dividers and see the awesome Glory of God filling the hearts of the people! ## The Weapons of Our Warfare- A series on our spiritual weapons - **Humility** By: Patrick Bucksot

When we walk in humility, we are walking in the Spirit of God. **Galatians 5:16** says – “Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh”. The rest of the chapter goes on to define the works of the flesh in verses 19-21. In my bible I have subtitled it “Rebellion defined.” In verses 22-26, the Word of God explains the Fruit of the Spirit which I subtitled as “Holiness defined.” When we walk in humility, we fulfill the law of God, verse 18. When we walk after the flesh, we will not inherit the Kingdom of God, verse 21.

I cannot write this article with the idea that walking in humility is easy. It is probably the hardest thing for a Christian to do. There are so many things that can cause us to forget about humility. When a person offends us, it is easy for our pride to swell within us. When someone sings our praises for a job well done, it is easy for us to swell with pride. When we make a mistake, it is so easy for us to become defensive and try to throw blame in another direction.

With that said, there are also a lot of opportunities for us to walk in humility. If you are working on a project with another person, and they have done at least half of the work, humility shares the credit. Even if you are the star athlete, humility shares credit with the other team mates. If you make a mistake, humility makes an admission of guilt and faces the consequences. If you are sitting on a bus and a woman with a child gets on, humility offers her the seat. If someone hurts you, humility forgives. If someone hates you, humility loves anyway. If someone is angry with you, humility offers gentleness in return.

Again, none of this is easy to walk in, but it is essential if we are to show the world that Jesus is a life changer. If we are to tell people that God loves them, we are to walk in love. If we are to show the world that God is forgiving, we are to walk in forgiveness. If we walk in humility with the purpose of giving God the glory, we become true lights of the gospel.

Let me give you one final warning. Do not walk in false humility. There are many that struggle with this phrase but I believe that it's real. Let me give you a scriptural reference. In **Luke 18:14** we have the story of the Publican and the Pharisee. The Pharisee, in his attempt to show God how humble he was, declared his goodness over others to God. He said this – “*God, I thank You that I am not like other men--*

*extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. I fast twice a week, I give tithes of all that I possess.*” I really don't think that God needed the Pharisee to tell Him his good deeds and godly exploits. How often do we compare ourselves to others? How often do we share how well we are working for God? How often do we tell others how much we give to the poor? How often do we belittle our efforts to others when we are actually fishing for compliments?

The publican on the other hand said this, *'God, be merciful to me a sinner!'* He knew that there was nothing good inside him. He knew that he had nothing to compare to anyone else. He knew that grace only comes from God. He knew that God was his source. Jesus said that the publican went home justified.

False humility is just another form of pride. It is a blind allusion that reeks with the odor of sin. However, true humility brings glory to God. When we walk in true humility, others will benefit. True humility raises others to new levels.

One final word. I now exhort you to study the scriptures. I pray that I have brought out the truth of God to you and raised your desire to walk in the fullness of God. Jesus was our ultimate example in all aspects of life and ministry. He loved without measure. He took no credit for Himself but desired that all of the people knew more about God. Even when his fame went abroad, His greatest desire was to declare the Kingdom of God rather than receive the praise of men. His humility was contagious. After the Holy Spirit was given, the Apostles were very clear that they were not the ones who healed people. They said that it was Jesus that was doing the work through them. So too are we to walk in this manner. Jesus said in the book of John several times that he was doing what He saw His Father doing, or he was doing what His Father told Him to do. In all of these instances, he was giving all glory to God. Jesus could have easily taken credit for the work that he was doing but chose to give it away. We have authority given to us to use the name of Jesus and His Word; however we have no authority to receive any credit for the work that God has called us too. Too many ministers have fallen from high places because of pride. Even if we are not in a high place, pride will make the fall seem as if we have fallen from a mountain top. Walk in humility because it is as close to God as we can get.

A new law has taken effect in North Carolina. It is now illegal, as of 10/01/09, to throw plastic bottles in the regular trash. This new law has put an emphasis on an old law as well. It has been illegal to throw aluminum cans in the regular trash since 1994. This is not a public service announcement but we should all do our part to support this law. There is now a recycle container at BOGIO, in between the restrooms, for plastics and aluminum cans. BOGIO Ministries will be taking this a little further with the collection of aluminum cans. We will be setting up a separate collection box for aluminum cans so we can take them to a recycling center. We would like to use the money raised to support Special Needs Baseball. This is a simple way to raise money without having fund raisers.

The organizers of Special Needs Baseball have been trusting God for everything and He has not let them down yet. Special Needs Baseball does not operate on a big budget, and desires to offer free baseball for its athletes. The collection of aluminum cans may not get them to the point of free baseball, but it may help in covering the cost of some of the athletes. SNB is also in need of an enclosed utility trailer. These funds may help with this expense also.

One of the founding principles of BOGIO Ministries is to bless other ministries so they can walk and work in their destiny. This is an excellent opportunity for us to do just that.
