Kindness By: Patrick Bucksot

Have you ever heard the phrase "Kill them with kindness?" It really seems kind of odd to think of killing in this way. As I looked this up on the internet, I found out that the phrase originated in this form - **kill with kindness as fond apes do their young** (presumably crushing them to death in a hug). It became a proverb of the 1500's. So I can dispel any thoughts that I have lost my marbles, I will make it clear now that I don't actually want you to kill anyone. But, I do want to share that we should be killing the old man of our lost friends and loved ones that don't know Jesus.

As I have ministered at BOGIO before, every believer in Christ has a calling from the Lord to minister to the lost. **2 Corinthians 5:17-21** - *Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new. Now all things are of God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Jesus Christ, **and has given us the ministry of reconciliation, that is, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation. Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God. For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.***

In this scripture, God reveals His heart toward us by showing that he believes in us to complete His work on the earth. We have been given an awesome responsibility of sharing His

love for all people of every nation, tribe and tongue. I like what the scripture says - "as though God were pleading through us". If God is pleading through us, are we sharing His message as He would? Are we sharing it with love? Does the world see the body of Christ as a body that loves at all costs or does it see his body painfully reacting to every blow on the chin? Don't get me wrong, the body of Christ has to be bold and stand up for God with righteousness. We can't bow down to the demands of the world. We must live what we preach though. We preach love and kindness and the world must see love and kindness.

1 Corinthians 13:4-8 - *Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails.*

We are supposed to be changing into the image of God by Jesus Christ, but what is the world seeing. The scripture in 1 Corinthians is the explicit image of Jesus. When we can put off our old man and live out these scriptures, we will be slaying the heart of our enemy that rules in the emptiness of a soul without Christ. God is not willing that any should perish; are we? If we are to bare the image of God, we must show kindness to all.

I have shared with someone before, "If you want friends, you have to be friendly".

Pastors Corner- A word from Pastor Ron – “Leap into the Deep”

2 Chronicles 7:14-16 & James 4:7-8

Wow it is already February and God is so good! I am so ready to Leap into the Deep of God! My hunger and passion for God is on the increase daily. I am so ready for the Lord to rip open heaven and pour out His awesome tangible Presence into us, the Body, so we can be Ushers of His Presence into this region! It is time for the lost to be saved, the people of this region to fall passionately in love with the Father, the sick healed, the hopeless restored, the struggling to become warriors, the Body to become Ushers of His presence and make Jesus Famous! Praise the Lord we have a part in the awesome Outpouring of the Lord in this region and around the world! Yes, we have a part; you have a part in the advancement of Kingdom of God!

BOGIO Church is in a Daniel Fast seeking the Lord and it is awesome! I am hearing many talk about the sacrifices and the rewards they are experiencing. I believe that this is going to be an impacting time. This is a time of transition into a powerful move of the Lord.

In my time of preparation for the Daniel Fast I asked the Lord, “What do you want me to fast about? The direction of the church; ministries, outreach, the people, growth, direction, evangelism, the finances of the church, overseas? Lord what do you want to be my focus of the fast?” And the Lord said very clearly, “No, even though each is important, focus on Me!” Wow what a statement. So I have spent my weeks of preparation time looking at ways I can put my focus on Him. Now that I have been in the fast for several weeks I am finding my hunger and passion growing to get to the very chambers of His heart. My desire to please the Lord, to become more Christ like, and to be a vessel to usher His presence has been getting stronger by every minute.

Intimacy (From Wikipedia encyclopedia) generally refers to the feeling of being in a close personal association and belonging together. It is a familiar and very close affective

connection with another as a result of entering deeply or closely into relationship through knowledge and experience of the other. Genuine intimacy in human relationships requires dialogue, transparency and vulnerability. As a verb "intimate" means "to state or make known".

James 4:7-8 states, “*Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you. Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners and purify your hearts You double-minded.*”

Submit to God and resist the devil -This is the starting point of leaping into the deep. Making a commitment to submit to God and resist the devil. Stop those things that try and draw you into remaining the same and not growing. When you submit you have to surrender. One of the hardest things in a person's life is total surrender but without it you can't get into the heart of God. Making the decision to, at any cost, shoot for the deepest we can get with God is the starting point to success.

Draw near to God and he will draw near to you- It is the deepest desire for the Father to draw close to His creation. We have to come to a place where we are so hungry, so thirsty, so starving for more of God and willing to do whatever it takes to get there. For us to reach this deep place, we have to find out what pleases God. We watched a film clip by Francis Frangipane on a Thursday night in January and he stated a powerful statement “*What pleases God is to seeing people Christ like*” If we want to move into a new place with the Lord, deeper and refreshing, we have to become so much like Christ that when the Father sees us He sees Christ. No we are not a replacement but a transformation from Glory to Glory into the same image (2 Cor. 3:16-18). We think that drawing close to God is only prayer and yes that important but there is more. To draw near to God we have to surrender and change our very being, thinking, reactions, actions, lifestyles into the very image of God. That is the transformation from Glory to Glory into the same image.

Cleanse your hands, you sinners and purify your hearts you double-minded. - The Greek word translated "double-minded" is dipsuchos, from dis, meaning "twice," and psuche, meaning "mind." James uses it to describe someone who is divided in his interests or loyalties, wavering, uncertain, two-faced, half-hearted. Even godly men in the Bible sometimes lapsed into double-mindedness. John, who baptized Jesus Christ, saw the Holy Spirit descend upon the Savior "in bodily form like a dove" and heard a voice from heaven declare, "You are My beloved Son; in You I am well pleased"(Luke 3:21-22) Yet, after landing in prison, where he would ultimately be beheaded, John sent men to Christ asking, "Are You the Coming One, or do we look for another?"(Luke 7:19-20). John the Baptist was human, and we begin to doubt when God seems not to respond to our prayers during a crisis.

We have to come to a place where we do not doubt God and place into submission the double-minded thoughts. We have surrender them to the Lord and make the decision to seek God at any cost! Repentance and surrender are

I can't count the times that I missed an opportunity to share the gospel with someone because I was not in the right frame of mind to do so. I did not have on the mind of Christ. I used to live in fear of company at our home. I would start off just fine, but after a while I would get overwhelmed and hide in the bedroom. I was not showing the kindness of God that He demanded of me. This wasn't just my struggle either. Beth had to pay a heavy price for my being inconsiderate. When we fall short in our calling, we are not the only one's affected. It affects those closest to us, and the people that God has placed in our path. If we are having a moment of ungraciousness, we will not share the gospel.

As a testimony of God's resurrection power, I can now rejoice at having company at our home. I love opening our home for our bible studies. I love having people over for Thanksgiving and any other occasion. It is in these moments that I get to share the love of God through kindness. God has delivered me from my oppression of loneliness and fear. God has been so good to Beth and me and has opened up ministry opportunities through this deliverance.

We are not called to be closet Christians. I am sure that you have heard someone say, "My faith is personal. It is between me and God". Part of this statement is true, it is personal. Meaning that we have to stand on our own faith and we cannot carry anyone else on our faith. The statement is incorrect with regard that it implies that we are not supposed to share our faith. Believers of God, it is our job to exalt the name of God through the Gospel of Jesus. **Matthew 28:19** - *Go therefore and **make disciples** of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.*

I will agree that everyone is not called to the ministry of a pastor, evangelist or teacher, but this is no excuse for us not to share our testimony.

When Jesus went to the well in Samaria, He had an appointment to change the life of the Samaritan woman. If you read the story all the way through, you will see a marked difference between Jesus' treatment of her and the hearts of the disciples. Jesus was killing her old life with the love and kindness of His Father. He showed her God's true compassion. His kindness allowed Him to enter in to the core of her heart and begin to clean it out. His kindness completely changed her life so much that she had to tell the other people in Samaria about Him. She did this at the risk of being ridiculed for her lifestyle. She showed the boldness of a veteran

Christian even though she was only minutes old. The people of Samaria believed her testimony and had to go see Jesus for themselves. They probably left Him thinking, "What she said was awesome, but He made God's love sound even better in person". It was neat that their experience with Jesus was so great, but it started with the testimony of a woman that probably had a bad reputation in the town. To me, that is the awesome part of the whole story. But I must go back to the kindness of Jesus. If He spoke to her as the disciples did to Him, the whole encounter would have been different.

It all starts with kindness. Why do I say that? I have to go back to a very old saying, "You never get a second chance to make a good first impression". We, as Christians, need to make the kindness of God the first thing that anyone sees. People need to see that we are Christians by our actions without having to ask if we are a Christian. Verbal testimony is powerful, but visual testimony is probably the first thing that people will encounter from us.

We have been given an incredible weapon of warfare in kindness. Kindness destroys the power of the enemy because it undermines his foundations of hatred, anger, envies, selfish ambitions, etc. There isn't much that can stand in the way of kindness. Yes, it can be very difficult to display kindness when the enemy sends a barrage of artillery at us. When he thinks that he has us on the ropes and we can still throw a smile at the enemy, he has to fall back and regroup. God will sustain you in those difficult times. He said in **James 4:7** - *Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you.* God is prepared to fight for us if we submit. We have to get over the idea that we can simply resist the devil. If we do not submit to God first, the devil will eat us for lunch. We must first submit to God. We have to act like pro wrestlers do when they get in a bind. We have to get close enough to God so we can submit to His strength and let Him take over with the fight. Let God fight our battles when we show kindness to others.

I can tell you first hand that living a life of kindness is a lot easier to live than fear, anger, and selfishness. Kindness has allowed me to meet so many awesome people. Kindness has allowed my marriage to grow to new heights. Kindness will make you look more like God than you have ever been. So as I conclude this article, I plead with you to "kill them with kindness." If you forget what I mean, reread the beginning of this article.

Nobody Know The Trouble I've Seen – By: Mary Faux

"Nobody knows the sorrow"... Have you ever heard this old song or even perhaps sang it yourself? This is an old refrain that is sung every day by everyone at one time or another. I started thinking about this and realized how singing this old tune affects our lives.

It is true that all of us face problems every day of our lives. But how we handle those problems is what defines our lives. As Christians, we face problems that are associated with being "in the world" and also problems that come from living in Christ and not being "of the world". I work at the hospital and see patients that have serious health problems everyday, some of which break my heart. These are people of all ages with life threatening difficulties and those who – thankfully – do not suffer with these problems. People also display different personalities in dealing with these illnesses. They generally fall into the same categories as the Seven Dwarfs - Doc, Grumpy, Sneezy, Sleepy, Dopey, Happy & Bashful!!

The **"Doc's"** can be the patients who know everything and you can't tell them anything!!! **"Grumpy"** is pretty common and can be just slightly grumpy and I can cheer them up by joking with them, or there are the really grumpy ones that try my patience. I've also seen **"Sneezy"** which is pretty self-explanatory. They just love to sneeze in my face without even an "excuse me". **"Sleepy"** sleeps in the lobby or even while I am registering them. **"Dopey"** can try the patience of a saint, as I have to literally pull the information out of them – they do not know why they came to the hospital or who their doctor is. **"Bashful"** can be the shy child who for reasons that are understandable, do not want needles stuck in them!! Adults are even worse than the kids!

And that leaves us with **"Happy"**. Now don't misunderstand me - these dear patients are not happy because they are ill. They are happy because they know the Lord!!

I can not even begin to tell you how blessed I am to minister to these patients. As soon as they find out that I love the Lord, they open up with a smile on their face and we "hold church" right at my desk for a few minutes. Many tell me that they do not know how they could have made it thus far without the love of God, their families, churches and prayers. They know that the "Lord will never leave nor forsake them". Deuteronomy 31: 6

"The joy of the Lord is their strength" as they go through their days. Nehemiah 8:10

The "Footprint Prayer" is always in their minds as we pray for the Lord to hold them in His arms.

"The peace that transcends all understanding" floods through their souls. Philippians 4:7

They know that the Lord is the great Physician and Healer and even though they may not be experiencing physical healing, they know that Our Lord hears their prayers and petitions and answers. Many have never heard of our Pastor Ron's statement: "Faith touches the anointing and releases the power of God", but they have experienced and seen that power. They know that praise strengthens their bodies and souls and gives them power over the *"enemy who comes to steal, kill and destroy"* John 10:10. I am an encourager and exhorter *"but let us encourage one another"* (1Thes 5:11) but many of these patients lift me up!!!

We all face difficulties and battles daily. We have financial burdens, family troubles, sickness, despair and so much more. Every time I ask the Lord to place me in another job, He will constantly reminded of the Apostle Paul who asked the Lord three times to remove a torment in this life. The Lord replied that *'My grace is sufficient for thee; for my strength is made perfect in weakness'* (2 Cor 7 – 10). I suffer from anxiety attacks at my job that are triggered by noise and too many people talking to me at once. The volume of people's voices rises up around me and engulfs me as if a tornado is swirling around me. The Lord shows me daily how I need to depend upon Him for strength and healing. Our Lord uses ordinary people - whom all have problems - to do extraordinary things. We do have the weapons to fight these attacks. Pray and praise are my two favorites. Many times I pray quietly in the Spirit as I go through the hospital (Eph 6:18-20) ¹⁸ *Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints;* ¹⁹*And for me, that utterance may be given unto me, that I may open my mouth boldly, to make known the mystery of the gospel,* ²⁰*For which I am an ambassador in bonds: that therein I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak."*

As I drive back and forth to work, I sing and shout (and hope the state troopers don't see me) and praise our Lord with all of my strength and might.
