Putting God In A Box- A series on how we limit God's work in our lives

Works – part 1 **By:** Patrick Bucksot

I can honestly say that I have never seen the American church, the body of Christ, busier than it is now. Churches are filled with programs for its members from senior adults to children. There is not a lack of activities for anyone to be involved with. I believe that this is in part because there is not a lack of great resources for the modern believer in Jesus Christ. Many of these activities include vacation Bible school for our youth, camping trips for whoever wishes to attend, teen retreats, senior trips, ski trips, chicken plate sales, yard sales, music practice, home fellowship groups, concerts of our favorite Christian artists, evangelistic meetings of our favorite ministers. The list could go on but I think we get the point. Every one of these events have the potential of bringing someone closer to the Lord, building unity within a specific church body, or even getting different churches to work together. With all of this "busyness", what would happen if we actually took a step back to evaluate our results? What do we really hope to accomplish with all that we are doing? And last but not least, what would God say in a performance evaluation of our "work" for the kingdom? I know that these are tough questions but we need to take a look at our "works" and judge them with the Word of God.

Before I go any further, please don't get the idea that I am against any of the things that I previously mentioned. Every one of them has a measure of merit and there are people being drawn to the Lord by them.

So let us look at the Word of God to see how works measure up to His works. It says in John 10:24, 25, *"Then came the Jews round about Him, and said unto Him, How long will you make us to doubt? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly. Jesus answered them, I told you, and you do not believe: the works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me."* And then in verse 38 Jesus said, *"but if I do, though you do not believe Me, believe the works, that you may know and believe that the Father is in Me, and I in Him."* Okay, what am I getting at with these verses? Jesus was very plain to the Jews that surrounded Him. He said that His works had one purpose, to glorify His Father. With works that glorify the Father, they will bear witness of the one doing the works. They will show that the one doing the works and the Father have become one, but not for the sake of the works. In other words, when we do something for the Lord, we don't become one with Him because of what we do, but because of our unselfish devotion to His glory.

One could say to me that James 2:24 says, *"You see then that a man is justified by works, and not by faith only"*. Yes, if we were to look at this verse standing alone, we could be made to believe that this is true. However, we cannot allow this verse to stand by itself. The preceding verses say that our works are an extension, or an outpouring of our faith. Works that come from our faith strictly follow what Jesus spoke about in John chapter 10 above.

Pastors Corner- “The Naaman Mentality”**2 Kings 5: 1-16**

As this month's BOGIO Newsletter goes out I will be in Uganda, Africa with two other men of God ministering from August 8-25th. Please keep our team in your prayers. I am excited with the trip knowing and expecting the Lord will show His glory in every area of the trip. We are expecting nothing less than signs, wonders and miracles. I will send an update of the signs and wonders and miracles in the September 2011 BOGIO Newsletter.

I have been studying the book of Revelation in a new and awesome way. I have been taught most my Christian life that the book of Revelation is the End Times book. And that is what it is but there is so much more. Most of my studies in Revelation were focused on the aspects of what I had been told by looking at the end time's message. But not long ago, around 6 months ago there has been a shift in how I am studying Revelations and what I am looking for when I study it. I do study to see what to expect in the end times but I have also been looking at it with new eyes as a glimpse into what Heaven is like.

As I draw my relationship deeper into the heart of God I am pulled into seeing and desiring more of Him. I am being given a new hunger to see what pleases Him and draws His presence into a place. Please do not misunderstand I believe that He is everywhere all the time! There is never anything we do or say that is a surprise or hidden for God. But there are times when His presence is tangible and touchable. I am also feeling a pull to find out what draws that tangible presence to us and how we can get from a visitation to habitation.

I have come to find out that it is the deepest desire of the Lord to not only have you choose Him but to also have a desperate intimate relationship with Him. Everything we are in our Christian walk is affected by our relationship level with the Lord. Before I go any further let me set some ground work and kick the enemy right out of it! Do not let the enemy say to you that you are unable to get deep into a relationship with the Lord because that is a lie! Everything I read, study, hear in my prayers is that the Lord longs for an intimate relationship with you. One of the biggest lies that keep the body of Christ away from walking in the most powerful power of God is telling you that your journey to relationship with the Lord completed at Salvation. It is started at Salvation and it grows from there. Everywhere I read in the Word of God show a desire to get closer to the Lord and the Lord to you. Cool thing about the Lord is that when we mess it up totally He is compassionate, forgiving and building in the relationship. No Timeout corner only compassion coming out.

Now back to my studies on Revelation. As I seek glimpses of Heaven and see how Worship is done in heaven it has brought a burning desire to have that level of worship coming out of me that opens heaven and calls down the Glory of God? (2 Chronicles 5:11-14 & 7:1-3) As I study the incredible worship of Heaven I see a common thread that runs through it all and that is the heart is pouring out to God. Not Complicated, No agenda's, No Time limits, No distractions, No obstacles just one common action, Hearts pouring out in unconditional, unrestricted pouring out of passionate intimate love to the Creator of all, the King of kings.

The Naaman Mentality

Why do we make it so complicated? Why do we make it so hard? The Lord has made it so simple, so understandable, so today!

2 Kings 5: 1-16 is the message about Naaman's Leprosy being healed. Look at who Naaman was, he was the Commander of the army of Syria. He had position of authority and respect. When he spoke people jumped to accomplish the task as fast and efficient as possible. So Naaman was a man that expected things done as expected them to be done. This authority was not just given to him he had earned it in battles. He was known as a man of valor, little to no fear. But one thing had his attention and brought him to become desperate, he was a leper.

Leprosy is an ugly disease, you latterly rot. Your skin, flesh, face, fingers, arms toes rot. I had seen a Leper colony in Japan many years ago when I was in the Marine Corps. It is a disease that is horrible. Naaman knew what leprosy would become in his life and he became disparate to be healed. God used a captive young girl to give the healing message to the one that held her Naaman. She told him to go to Samaria to the Prophet he would be healed. A little girl from the land of Israel tells her captor from Syria that he can be healed if he goes to see a prophet (Elisha) he will be healed. How simple is that? Not complicated, not hard, not confusing, just simple, “Go and be healed!”

Here is Naaman when he arrives from a long trip to Samaria and to the doorstep of Elisha expecting him to come and greet this man of valor, this commander of army's and do whatever he is to do and he would be healed (The Namaan Mentality). But it didn't happen that way. CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE

Naaman arrived and Elisha did not come to

the door to greet this mighty man of honor from Syria. Elisha sent a messenger to him and told him to go and wash in the Jordan seven times and his flesh would be restored and you shall be clean.” How simple is that? Go wash 7 times in the Jordan and you will be healed.

Naaman became furious. Why? Because his healing did not come the way he expected it to come. He started coming against the simple instructions and complicating them immediately (the effects from a Naaman Mentality). We expect this incredible waving of hands and people thrown back 10 feet all over the floor or some light shining from heaven like a spotlight over the sick person in order for them to be healed or for us to step out in faith. When God makes it very simple what to do and heavenly results pour out. We think that we have to have all this incredible degrees or education to do anything in the Kingdom of God when He is just looking for people (the believer Mark 16:14-20) to step up and step out. It is so simple. You have the invitation to just do it!

Here is an example; On Sunday July 24, 2011 a mighty anointed woman of God named Joan Hunter was at our church Breath of God International Outreach, in New Bern, North Carolina. She carries a heavy healing anointing. She teaches as she prays for people and they are healed so that the Body of Christ will understand how easy it is to pray and see results. On that Sunday night she had a corporate prayer over the entire congregation for salvation. A young woman gave her life to Jesus that night and was so filled with God that on the next day (Monday, July 25, 2011) she went out seeking someone that needed healing. She went on a mission to find the sick! When she met a man that was sick and needed healing she asked if she could pray for him and he would be healed. He said, “Sure”. She prayed a simple 1 minute prayer that she learned the night before and he was healed. Then lead him to the Lord. A new believer for only 24 hours goes out and not only finds a sick man but an unsaved sick man prays for his healing and he is healed then leads him to Christ! How much more simple can it be?

Naaman even tried to undermine the word given to him by saying that his waters in his country are better than the Jordan. And he left in a rage (again the Naaman Mentality). A servant spoke life into a desperate, disappointed and angry man which turned his disappointment and anger into humility and obedience. The servant said, “My father, if the prophet had told you to do something great, would you not have done it? How much more then, when he says to you, Wash and be clean?” Sometimes we need someone to bring us back to reality and look at the simplicity of the Word given to us by the Lord.

Naaman did something that was incredible; before he could wash in the Jordan he had to expose himself and the leprosy.

When Naaman tossed his pride, misdirected expectations, disappointments, and embarrassment aside and took control of his anger he did what he was told to do by the man of God (Elisha) he was healed. Not on the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th or even the 6th time he dipped but on the 7th time when he emerged from the Jordan he was not only healed but his flesh was restored like the flesh of a child. God does everything with excellence. It was simple and heavenly Powerful!

What is holding the Body of Christ from fulfilling our destiny?

The two biggest obstacles (not the only ones) I believe are fear and the Naaman Mentality.

We have through the years made what the Lord has made so simple so complicated and are missing the blessings of Mark 16: 14-20. It is not about being seen as a Highly Spiritual Person but that the person He has placed in front of you would see the reality of Christ and be changed for eternity. I believe this is a time that the Lord deeply desires us to come to a place in our relationship with Him that draws us into a place to get the Naaman Mentality out of our lives and get back to the simple understanding that God does not make it complicated just really simple. We have to get to a place of understand that we are not the healer but we are the ones called to pray for the healing. When we go out and just do it, and not try and make it complicated, just do it we will see a move of God that will blow your socks off! There is a statement I have been hearing that really puts everything I have written about in this article into perspective, “ When you just go do it and take control of the fear and put it under your feet, You turn “Fear” into “Fun”. It is so incredibly fun to see people’s lives changed forever, their fears, depressions, oppressions, pains, heartbreaks, doubts, sickness thrown back to hell and they receive Grace, Love, Peace, Wholeness, Salvation, Healing, Restoration, Refreshment, Joy, Happiness, Excitement and Freedom and all this is through Jesus using you to grab a hand and walk them through His doorway! That is when Fear is destroyed and Fun is put back into its place! It is so addictive to see distressed faces turning into Joyful smiles.

Don’t sit on the beach just dreaming of riding the Waves of Glory, Jump in and ride the Wave of Glory.

This chapter in James also said that our faith has to have an outpouring of works that glorify the Father or our faith will be dead. How will our faith die without works? Without works being poured out from our faith, we will not have an understanding of our purpose within the kingdom of God. Without purpose we will stop seeing the hand of God moving in our lives. Without purpose, we will be living without direction. Without purpose and direction there is no hope, and without hope death quickly follows. It is not just important to be built up in the faith but to seek opportunities to share our faith and give God the glory. James was correct in saying that we are not just justified by our faith alone but often times we misunderstand the balance needed between works and faith. We become so inundated with works of duty rather than works of faith and calling, that we lose sight of why we are serving God.

The main problem that we have, is believing that we have to do things to please God or earn His love. This belief is completely unfounded and is contrary to the Word of God. There is absolutely nothing that we can do to make God love us any more than He already does. There is nothing that we could have done to stop Jesus from going to the cross on our behalf. We have been freely given the grace of God without any requirement to do anything but accept the sacrifice of Jesus for our sins. God's grace has been mentioned as His unmerited favor over us. In other words, we did not deserve to have our sin debt paid for. This work that Jesus did on the cross was for our benefit and the glory of His Father. The reason He endured the cross for us was the joy that was set before Him. (Heb. 12:2)

The reason that we cannot be justified by our works is because they will end up becoming opportunities for us to boast about what we are doing for God. Our faith is to produce action but we must always remember that our actions are for the glory of God. I believe that God would rather have people express their faith in complete anonymity than pronouncing what we do for the praise of men. Matt. 6:16-18 says, *“Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their*

reward. But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly. Jesus is talking about individuals who performed works of faith as if other people were their audience. These efforts may have started out for the glory of God but eventually became opportunities to get attention and sympathy rather than to seek the face of God. Their reward was the admiration of men rather than an incorruptible reward from heaven. Our works can't be an object of our boasting. God is the One who deserves and should be the object of our boasts. When our faith results in an outpouring of works, we will not be consumed by the idea of drawing attention to ourselves. Rather, faith produced works don't desire any attention but that which should be directed at God.

When our faith produces works we are operating from a debt free life to please the Father. What do I mean by this? When our only motive for our “Faith Works” is to please the Father, we are not in bondage to our works. When our works become an attempt to please the Father because He has a reward for us, we have then inherited a debt that we cannot work hard enough to pay. When we worry more about getting stars in our heavenly crowns than actually doing something just because we just want to give God more glory, we have lost sight of why our faith produces its works. If all we do is worry about our reward in heaven we place ourselves in a position of competition with others for God's favor. We will become like the servants in Matthew 20. In this chapter, the servants who began work at the beginning of the day were mad that the servants hired at the end of the day received the same pay as them. The master said that the wages were his to give out. The same goes with the rewards that God has laid up in heaven; they are His to hand out. We are not in competition with anyone for God's favor.

In John 14:12, Jesus said, *“Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater works than these he will do, because I go to My Father”.* What works will we be doing that Jesus did but in more abundance?

When Jesus read from the book of Isaiah in Luke 4:18, He proclaimed these as some of the works He was called to do in His Father's name: *He was anointed to preach the gospel to the poor; He was sent to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and recover sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are bruised; and to preach the acceptable year of the Lord.* So, if we want to do works that bring glory to the Father we should start off with these. We should be preaching the gospel and bringing people into the kingdom for His glory. We should be healing the broken hearted for His glory. We should be proclaiming that there is liberty and freedom in the Lord to those who are held captive to sin. We should be opening the eyes of those who are blind. When called to do so, we should be praying for the healing of those who are physically blind; however, we should also be filled up with His Word and anointed to open the eyes of them who are spiritually blind. John chapter 9 discusses both types of blindness and I encourage you to read this for understanding. We should be finding those who are bruised/broken and setting them free with the Word of God. we should be preaching the acceptable year of the Lord and doing it all in love.

How do we do these things if we do not know where to start? There are four references in the book of Matthew and Mark that says Jesus was moved with compassion. This compassion was not conjured up from His own desire and purpose. It ties directly in with His love and passion for His Father as I wrote about earlier in the article. When our faith for God expands into a passion for Him, we will produce works that will bring Him glory. Out of our passion for Him we will develop compassion and love for the lost, broken hearted, the captives, those who are blind and them that are bruised. Out of our compassion, God will anoint us to do His work and people will be drawn closer to Him. The

glorious thing about all of this is that when we operate with this anointing we will not have a desire to be seen or glorified. Our desire will be for people to see God only. I started out with a list of things that keep us busy in the church but I must relate one more vital work that Jesus called for us to do. In Matthew 28:19, 20, Jesus said "*Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you: and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age*". In the busyness of our church lives, are we just having fun or making disciples. I'm not saying that we can't have fun in church but my point is this, with all that we are doing together, are we actually getting closer to the Lord? Are we drawing the lost into our congregations and raising numbers or disciples? Are we preparing our people for ministry so they can fulfill their calling or are we keeping them on a diet of spiritual baby food so they won't put us out of our positions? I believe that our resources and activities are all good things and deserve some merit; however, we need to seek God's face to see if we, as individuals, need to go to everything and do everything. No one can do everything, which is why we are part of a body. Ephesians 4:16 says, "*from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love*". Everyone in the body must do their part so the body will grow and be edified in love. There are a lot of great resources for the body of Christ and we must use wisdom so those resources don't become a work of debt rather than a work of faith. And lastly we need to keep this in mind; if what we are doing is not a labor of love (for God) it will become a labor in vain.
