The Weapons of Our Warfare- A series on our spiritual weapons -

Praise Bv: Patrick Bucksot

We are to the point that the weapons of our warfare are beginning to intermingle. To clarify, all of our weapons can and should be used together, but it seems that certain weapons are like bread and butter. They just go together. You should be able to read these articles and think of a time when you used two or three weapons to overcome something. So don't just get locked into the weapon that I write about, remind yourself of them all and use each of them as needed.

The weapon for this month is **Praise**. God is very adamant that his saints offer Him praise. He does not want praise because it boosts His ego. That is what we do when we seek the praise of others. God knows exactly who He is. He desires praise because He loves us. He desires an intimate relationship with his creation. The thing about praise is being able to offer it any time. I have been to several churches that had a time set aside for "Praise Reports". Most of these praise reports were offered to God for meeting a need such as money, a job, healing, etc. It is so awesome to hear about God's provision because they encourage the faith of others. The praise reports that get little mention are these: "I praise God for who He is." "I praise God for His infinite mercy."

Any kind of praise offering is good, but those which proclaim the majesty of God for no other reason but we are proclaiming his majesty touches the heart of God. The reason for this is because praising him for His provision

will go lacking when we can't see Him providing what we think we need. If we can't see God in our situation, we have difficulty offering praises. Offering praises for what God provides could be called "**Provisional Praise**."

In the book of Psalms, David offers many insights to how we should praise God. I obviously don't have enough room in this article to give you all of his examples, but I will share a few.

Ps. 7:17 *I will praise the LORD according to his righteousness: and will sing praise to the name of the LORD most high.*

Ps. 48:10 *According to Your name, O God, So [is] Your praise to the ends of the earth; Your right hand is full of righteousness.*

Ps. 54:6 *I will freely sacrifice to You; I will praise Your name, O LORD, for [it is] good.*

Ps. 99:3 *Let them praise Your great and awesome name-- He [is] holy.*

David knew that it was important to praise God. Praising God all of the time helped David remember God's greatness when he was faced with difficult times. David continually reminded himself who God was and that he (David) had a refuge in God.

One of the best known scriptures for a powerful offering of praise is **Acts 16:25**. In Acts 16, Paul and Silas were beaten and jailed for casting a demon out of the woman who practiced divination. I am sure that most of us would be thinking that we missed God's calling if we were beaten and jailed. Paul and Silas apparently didn't think this because verse **25** says:

"And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them."

Pastors Corner- A word from Pastor Ron – “Preparing for a moment with the King”

I have been feeling a tug on my heart for some time to just get back to the basics of my relationship with God. This journey has been and will be awesome as I walk hand in hand with the King of Kings.

When I was in the Marine Corps, I had a job called Crash Fire Rescue / Search Air Rescue. When I joined back in 1972 I was a young man that had the world by the tail. I woke up real fast as I went to my first helicopter crash and there were Marines injured and even some that died. I was 17 years old. Our rescue equipment all fit into a back pack that we carried on our back and we flew on Huey helicopter. When we arrived we would first of all find the crew of the downed aircraft and we would do what is called ABC's (Airway clear, Breathing, Circulation (heart check) First Aid then we would rescue them from harm and treat their injuries. All of our rescue equipment & medical equipment fit into two backpacks. When I retired 21 years later there was a fleet of vehicles and equipment to perform the service of rescue, fire, medical for any type of emergency. But even with millions of dollars of equipment and vehicles when we came upon a rescue situation we had to first do the basic ABC's of First Aid or the one we there to rescue would die.

Sometimes we get so wrapped up in doing stuff or in being so spiritual that we forget the basic ABC's of our relationship with the Lord. We get so busy we forget to check our ABC's of our relationship to see if it is healthy. It is so important to “STOP!” And take a moment and perform the ABC's of our relationship with the Father.

I have been pressed to read the scriptures that show the many people of God that would prepare before stepping into the presence of the Lord. There was a preparation time before the moment of the audience of God. We are so much a “*Right Now*” people that we do not prepare at all to stand in the presence of the One that holds the universe together.

The very first thing is our “*Airway*”. What happens if your airway is not open? You cannot take breaths. Without that you will not survive. Is your airway open to God? Are you opening up the pathway that God needs to pour His awesome love, grace, peace, wisdom, direction? There are times when we close or restrict our airway and we get some breath, enough to keep us alive but we become weak because there is not enough to get energy. When we clear an airway we tilt the head back. With our spiritual airway we need to tilt our

head back. When you tilt your head back you are looking into the heavens. Place your focus on His face, not what you can gain for yourself. Exodus 33 Moses just wanted to see His face. God said no man can see my face and live but I will place you here in a corner of the rock and place my hand over you and as I pass I will remove my hand and you will see my back. It is the desire of the Father to have you seek to look at Him. His desire is to take you back into a special relationship area of His heart, the Garden of Eden experience. There is but only one way to get there, seek His face and it will carry you to a path to his heart.

Second, “*Breathing*”; are you breathing in God or the contamination of the world? I remember being stationed in California when I was in the Marine Corps. Smog was terrible. It burned your eyes and burned your lungs to take a breath. There was a haze over most of the cities that showed the smog heaviness. I remember that once a year the Santa Ana winds from the desert came and blew the smog away. The sky was blue, your eyes were not hurting, and your lungs did not hurt. The contamination of the smog was gone. Are you breathing in the breath of the Lord or the contaminations of the world? The Breath of God brings life not death. Every time the Lord blew His breath on something it became alive. (**Genesis 2:7; Ezekiel 37**). Are you breathing in the awesome Breath of God? Are you reading His word and applying His Word to every part of your life? Are you investing time in the relationship with the King of Kings?

Third is “*Circulation or pulse*”; Are you alive for God? The heart is the life pump of your natural body. It beats normal as you function normally, it beats fast when you are excited and active, it can beat slow and become dangerous to your very life, and it can stop beating and there is death. Is your heart beating for God with passion for Him? Are you seeking ways to bless Him and the people around you for God? Are you operating in the normal of God, where your heart is compassionate for others and those in need? Are you sharing the Love of the Father? Is your heart beating fast and are you becoming more excited about what the Lord is doing in your life, and the lives of those you come in contact with? Is your relationship with God becoming more exciting every day? Or is your heart for God beating slow and weak and you are exhausted and discouraged? Are you feeling hopeless or left out?

Ministry Spotlight – The Ministry of Intercession by Mary Faux

This is a time of increased spiritual warfare. The Lord has impressed on many of His children that time is urgent now. Too many people are lost and without hope and are turning to the world and its snares, addictions, greed and immorality to seek what they are missing in their lives. As God's people, we must stand in the gap for those who are lost, with intercessory prayer. But how? During the years, I have read many books on prayer and each writer had much to say that resulted in confusion on my part. I decided that to become more effective in lifting up others before the Lord, I needed to learn how to go about it. The Holy Spirit revealed much to me which I hope will bless others.

Why do we pray? Is it a habit or a wish list presented to God? Do we pray to impress ourselves and others? Do we read a prayer out of a book? Do we pray for others through the experience that we have had in our own lives?

In intercession, we rouse ourselves to get the mind of Christ about whom we pray. We must be broken vessels, willing to receive the Holy Spirit and put ourselves deliberately before Christ in order to truly see what Christ sees about others. Our personal sympathies and feelings must be set aside, as these emotions will rule our prayer. We can not rely on our own emotions, as they are not dependable and change rapidly. Only Christ can give us discernment on how we are to lift up others before Him and form the mind of Christ about them in order to intercede on His behalf.

Ephesians 6:18 *Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints;*

Worship and intercession go together. Remember that true intercession is warfare against the powers and principalities that rule this earth. The enemy does not want us to pray and attacks any holes in our armor that can be found through the unresolved issues and problems in our lives. We cannot come before God without repentance in our own lives. Repentance and the laying down of our own lives before the Father strengthens our armor so we can do our work of intercession as the Holy Spirit directs. I love to start my time of intercession with praise and worship of our Father. God inhabits the praises of his people and I begin to realize the anointing that settles about me and my mind, soul and spirit begins to become one with the Father.

Romans 8: 27 *Now He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit [is], because He makes intercession for the saints according to [the will of] God.*

Did you realize that the Holy Spirit that dwells in each of us also prays for us? The Holy Spirit prays for us in such a way that we cannot pray in. There are many times in my life, when I cannot find the words to express what I wish to say. But the Holy Spirit prays for us in such a way that we can't express. The Holy Spirit hears the groanings of our souls, hears our cries and calls out to the Lord for us. Our bodies are temples for the Holy Spirit to dwell in and we must guard that temple to keep it pure before the Lord. As Jesus Christ swept through the temple cleaning out the unholy, we will make the conscious decision to live our lives clean before Him and daily create a clean temple for the Holy Spirit to dwell in. The Lord searches our hearts to hear the Holy Spirit. Guard your heart and keep it before the Lord. This will become an unconscious act on our part as we become more in tune and harmony with the Lord. Our daily lives will sing out to the Lord in praise, worship and supplication for the saints that the Lord sets before us.

Please do not be afraid to turn yourself over to the Holy Spirit, rid yourself of whatever holds you back. Human beings like to control situations and feel we lose control if we turn ourselves over to the Holy Spirit. A friend of mine once said she wanted to know what she was saying if she spoke in tongues. She doesn't understand that as we embrace the Holy Spirit living in us, we are indeed set free. My own worship is more meaningful now because I am set free to let the Holy Spirit express my soul and heart.

Romans 8:26 *Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered..*

All of my study on this has come from the book "My Utmost for His Highest" by Oswald Chambers and also from our own Pastor Ron. Thank you, Pastor Ron, for your selfless devotion to the Lord and your flock. This is just the beginning of a lifetime of learning and perfecting myself before the Lord. I now have a new confidence as the Lord reveals even more to me through the Holy Spirit about my ministries.

The situation for Paul and Silas was very serious. They had no idea what their captors had in mind for them. I am sure that they could have been facing a death penalty. With all of this possibly going through their minds, they still prayed and sang praises to God. They knew that God had called them to Macedonia. They knew that they were doing what God had called them to do. They also knew that this battle was not theirs to fight. Their only option was to continue working for God. At midnight, they offered themselves possibly for the last time. They prayed and sang praises. The verse says that the other prisoners heard them. Verse 26 says that God also heard them and answered. An earthquake shook the foundations of the prison and opened every door. No prisoner escaped and the jailer immediately gave his heart to God.

Although it is not likely that we would be beaten and go to jail for doing the will of God, we will have trials. (However, let's not be so arrogant to think that we won't be beaten or jailed. Christians are quickly heading into great persecution.) When we go through our trials, what do we do? Do we get angry? Do we fall apart and throw a pity party? Do we cry out to God and proclaim that it's not fair? Do we think that God has left us on our own? Or do we offer praises of His tender mercies. Do we offer praises because His name is Holy? Do we offer praises because our righteousness comes only from Him?

The group, Casting Crowns has a song out called: "*Praise You in This Storm*". The whole song is a good reminder that God will never leave us or forsake us. The words of the chorus read as follows:

And I'll praise you in this storm
and I will lift my hands
for You are who You are
no matter where I am
and every tear I've cried
You hold in your hand
You never left my side

The part that really strikes home with me is when he wrote "for You are who You are, no matter where I am". This statement offers praise to God no matter the circumstance. The writer understood that praise for who God is should not be dependent on His provision or our circumstances.

It has never been said that everything would be easy when serving God. Quite the contrary. We will have plenty of times when we seem to be indestructible Christians. It is as if everything we touch becomes a blessing. There will also be those times when our problems seem to run us over. With that said, God offers his assurance that He is in control. I know that there are times when we don't feel loved by him or see his hand working on our behalf. But **GOD IS IN CONTROL**.

There is another song written by Babbie Mason. It is called "*Trust His Heart*". The song speaks of the difficulty when we are going through a hard time and we can't see God. This song is also a reminder that God has not left us hanging by ourselves. The chorus of this song follows:

God is too wise to be mistaken
God is too good to be unkind
So when you don't understand
When you don't see His plan
When you can't trace His hand
Trust His heart
Trust His heart

Again, I am gripped by the words, "When you don't see his plan; when you can't trace his hand; Trust His heart"

King David, Paul and Silas and a whole host of others trusted the heart of God. They understood the heart of God and how He always came through. The patriarchs of the Bible knew how to offer up heartfelt praises to God. They saw the hand of God move many times on their behalf, but did not limit His praises to His provision.

We must always remember to offer up praises to God for anything and everything. We must live in a state of thankfulness. Yes, be thankful for how and what God provides. BUT, start getting into the habit of praising God just for being God. Praise Him because He IS holy. Praise Him because He IS worthy of our praise. Praise Him for His sacrifice. Praise Him for His mercy. Praise Him for He IS good. Praise Him for His love. Praise Him for His grace. Praise Him because He IS righteous. Praise Him for His names sake. Praise Him for the strength of His right hand. Praise Him just because.

Reality Check: By Beth Bucksot

James 5:13-16 ¹³ *Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms.* ¹⁴ *Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord.* ¹⁵ *And the prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.* ¹⁶ *Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much.*

Gen. 15:6 (Speaking of Abraham) ⁶ *And he believed in the LORD, and He accounted it to him for righteousness.*

Psalms 106:30 ³⁰ *Then Phinehas stood up and executed judgment,*

And the plague was stopped.

³¹ *And that was accounted to him for righteousness To all generations forevermore.*

Romans 4:3 ³ For what does the Scripture say? *“Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness.”*

F.F. Bosworth Wrote in *Christ the Healer* pg 126: “What constitutes a righteous man? Over and over again we are told that Abraham was counted righteous. The story as to how his righteousness was determined is very simple. He believed God and acted accordingly.”

In Matt. 9:1-7 we see a man sick with the palsy brought to Jesus. Jesus said to him, *“Son, be of good cheer; your sins are forgiven.”* Some of the scribes there did not understand the power or the anointing of forgiveness and thought Jesus was blasphemous. He rebuked them for the evil in their hearts and then revealed the powerful anointing of what forgiveness could do. He then says in **vs. 6**; *“But that you may know that he Son of Man has power to on earth to forgive sins, (He then says to the sick of the palsy) arise, take up your bed and go to your house.”* **Vs. 8** says *“Now when the multitudes saw it, they marveled^a and glorified God, who had given such power to men.”* Jesus did not rebuke them for saying that such power was given to men. (It is important to note that “men” is plural)

God has given us the power to forgive, and that power is also anointed to heal. Forgiveness heals minds. Where there is a lack of forgiveness, there is a lack of God’s love in us. A spirit of fear (control and manipulation work with fear) will attack our minds. Fear leaves an opening for vain imaginations and strongholds to attach to our mind and then invade our heart and soul to the point we act and react in ungodly ways. **I John 4:18** *“There is no fear in love; but perfect (or complete) love casts out fear, because fear involves torment. But he who fears has not been made perfect in love.”* Does this scripture mean that we will never fear? No! Unforgiveness, love issues and fear do try to grab us all. No one is immune to this. However, we do have the power to forgive. You’re probably thinking, “So sister, that’s easy for you to say. You don’t know my story. You haven’t walked through what I’ve been in my life. I have a right to be angry. There are some things you

just don’t forgive.” My response to you is this: You don’t know my story or the stories of people that you encounter daily. Do not justify unforgiveness because you think you have a right to it or that your suffering is greater than the rest of humanity. You do not have the “corner on the market” on being hurt and betrayed. That is a lie from the pits of hell. That lie is custom designed to separate you from God and from those God has called you to love. It is a lie that will bury you in your own self-righteousness and cause your vision of other people and their weaknesses to be distorted. This distorted vision not only affects those who we hold unforgiveness toward, but also affects our attitude and behavior towards everyone we encounter. We become harder, less compassionate, bitter, easily offended and downright resentful. These things affect the flow of the anointing and can make it difficult or even impossible for people to receive from God through us. Why? Because we are not a safe person with whom to come in contact—we bite too much.

So why should we forgive? Because God said so! Remember that Abraham believed God and it was counted as righteousness. Remember that the prayer of a righteous man avails much. Righteousness is right standing with God. If we want our prayers to avail much we need to be righteous before God when unforgiveness is reigning over us instead of His perfect love. You are probably thinking “Prove it”. Okay, here is what God’s word says about us and unforgiveness: **Matt 6:9-15** in **vs. 12** of the Lord’s Prayer, Jesus says “And forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.” **Vs. 14 & 15** “For if you forgive men their trespasses, your Heavenly Father will also forgive you. But, if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Heavenly Father forgive your trespasses.” If God will not forgive us because we will not forgive others, there is a separation from Him. It is the sin of unforgiveness.

In Matt. 18: 21-35 Peter asked Jesus how many times he had to forgive—he asked *“till seven times?”* Peter thought that seven times is a lot, and truthfully to us, it is! But Jesus said *“not seven times, but until seventy times seven.”* (Seven is the number of completion—remember “Perfect love casts out all fear” the word perfect here means complete) **vs. 23-33** Jesus went on to give us an example of a servant who begs his king for forgiveness, receives it and then refuses to extend mercy and forgiveness to his fellow servant. The consequences are listed in **vs. 34 & 35**. The king became angry with the unforgiving servant and delivered him to the tormentors until he could repay the king all that was due him. He then tells us that this is what our Heavenly Father will do to us if we do not, from our hearts, forgive others. I don’t know about you, but I can never, ever repay our Heavenly Father all that I owe Him. With God’s help, I will try to extend forgiveness and mercy so that the flow of that anointing from God can flow over me and through me to other people.

REALITY CHECK: By Beth Bucksot

Just as forgiveness healed the lame man, it heals us. It heals mentally, it heals emotionally, it heals physically, and most importantly, it heals spiritually and then heals our land.

Forgiving does not mean that we don't guard ourselves-that would be foolish. There is a difference between forgiving and setting ourselves up to be abused over and over again. Walk in wisdom. Ask God for it and He will show you how to walk in a spirit of forgiveness, love and mercy without becoming a constant victim.

Something that usually helps me to forgive is to pray that God will help me see that person (or those persons) the way He does. Also repenting of my sins, asking Him to clean me first and renew a right spirit in me first usually clears up my perspective or vision of others. (**James 5:16**) Whenever we do this, the love of God prevails. The word says that love covers a multitude of sins; while we were yet sinners Christ died for us. As Christ's love and blood covered our sins, we must also allow it to cover other peoples sins, weaknesses and flaws.

At the beginning I shared a statement about Abraham from F.F. Bosworth's book. "he believed God and acted accordingly." This is what we must do with forgiveness. Believe God, choose to submit our will to His, forgive and then act accordingly. Even if our feelings are still trying to rule us we can choose to act according to forgiveness. Once we start acting accordingly, over time, healing will come to us and our feelings will recede or even go away.

Let the anointed, healing power of forgiveness move in your life and your joy will be made full. Let forgiveness flow, watch your Heavenly Father hear you, take delight in you and the blessings of Heavenly things pour over you. God Bless you!
